**4. Student Council Report** – Alyana Carlos, the Jasper High Student Council co-chair, provided an update to the council of their activities including the various themed days held this past month; the Terry Fox run raised over \$300, denim day and pj day. She reported the Halloween dance was a great success raising almost \$900. The next dance will be the Christmas dance December 12<sup>th</sup>. The student council is also involved with initiating Flex games during a flex period once a month in the gym.

**6.1 Barb Madsen – International Education and Literacy presentation.** Barb provided an overview of her position with Grande Yellowhead Public School Division as support for the literacy program as well as International Education. Barb's background is in education and taught English at Harry Collinge High School in Hinton. The Division has implemented a focus on literacy across all subjects. It continues to be a focus for all schools as well as professional development. The council took a walk about through a few classrooms to see how some teachers are using literacy strategies.

The International student program for GYPSD mainly places students in Jasper however there are currently students placed in Hinton and on occasion in other communities. The focus of the program is to bring International students to the Division and Jasper has benefitted greatly from this program. A list of families who would be willing to host students would be helpful.

**5. Old Business**

**5.1 Jasper Activity & Aquatic Centre** – It was reported that the renovation at the Aquatic Centre is on schedule and that 90% of the facility is slated to open December 20<sup>th</sup>. Daily statistics this fall show that students are returning to the facility to renew their passes. A reminder should be sent to parents in the next newsletter so they know that the opportunity for Jasper youth exists to use the facility at no cost but that parents are required to sign for each student and agree to the terms of use.

**6.1 Options program;** for the 4<sup>th</sup> quarter numeracy and problem solving was added and archery was removed from the lists of Junior High options. Students will now have the benefit from added math should they require or want extra attention in this subject. Numeracy as well as a Literacy class are also being offered again in the 3<sup>rd</sup> quarter. Some of the same students are targeted for both classes and teachers work together to determine which would be more beneficial. Health is a mandated class for Junior High students by the Alberta Govt and will be offered in the 3<sup>rd</sup> quarter as well.

**6.2 Staffing;** Mark informed the group that Lauren Kennedy has resigned her position effective the end of January. Two applicants have been received to replace her position.. Karen Hukaluk has moved to JES which leaves a 9 hour/week administration position. A big thanks to Heather Legacy who has taken on this extra work proficiently. Mark commended GYPSD central office for not laying off teachers however more tightening is to come from the AB govt. A funding model change is in the works from the AB Govt and not from our school board.

**6.3 Activity Day;** This is the last day of school before the Winter Break, Friday December 20th. Lots of fun activities around the school are planned as well as a hot dog lunch for the students. Mark will make a call out to parents for snacks for the students.

**7.1 Principal's Report - Mark Crozier;** reported in new business.

**7.2 Trustee Report – Dale Karpluk.** Dale reported that the recent auditors report of the GYPSD 2018 budget was on target. The AB govt has however since then, taken away three grants and replaced it with something different. As well, insurance costs have risen by 1 million dollars. As a result the division is facing a 3 million dollar deficit. The division has frozen hiring. A new AB govt budget will be tabled in February and we should know more at that time. The environment is a bit uncertain however with our current Premier's attention towards private schools and what is perceived that he wants to increase funding for private schools with public revenues. We all must work together to promote and be Champions of our public education.

**7.4 CPF Report – Brenda Shepherd/Amber Stewart.** Brenda reported that the recent games night at JES was very successful with 100+ in attendance. Approx. 7 students from the high school went to help with the evening which was a great addition. Thanks Eric for setting that up. The question of the DELF test was brought up and Eric reported that the current grade



10's will have the opportunity to write one of the tests (B1 or B2) in the next two years. There may be teachers in Hinton who are certified as an option for our students.

5.0 OLD BUSINESS

5.1 Honour Roll in the Fitzhugh—Krista has found 2 sponsors for the next 2 honour roll announcements in the paper. The sponsor of the February 20<sup>th</sup> issue wishes to remain anonymous. The sponsor of the ad that will come out in April is McClelland, Stolfa, Reed Barristers & Solicitors. A 20% discount is applied to the cost of the ad which is usually around \$400.00.

6.0 NEW BUSINESS

6.1 Thank you from the Staff—A big "Thank You" goes out to the Parent Council and parents of JJSJS students for the snacks and lunch for Teacher Appreciation Week. It is our pleasure!

6.2 Accountability Pillar—Grade 7 and 10 parents will receive a survey to fill out. A lot of time goes into the improvement plan, so please fill it out.

6.3 Foods Class cost—The basics are supplied, but anything beyond is purchased by the students. This can be \$40 to \$50 per class if cooking. The cooking is usually done as a group project and can be a shared expense. However, this expense is covered for Junior High students. There are units over the course of the semester that require more than what is provided. The recipes for Senior High students have more choices. It costs \$40.00 for Foods Class. There are no extra funds to put towards the class. Miss Cross has brought in some guests to share their cooking knowledge.

6.4 Experiences Canada—There are 25 kids and 3 adults going to Quebec. They leave on February 13<sup>th</sup> and are back on the 22<sup>nd</sup>. The Quebec students will be here from March 13<sup>th</sup> to 20<sup>th</sup>. Hopefully by combining grade 8 and 9 this year, this trip can become a grade 8 trip for the foreseeable future.

6.5 Staffing—Mr. Fraser and his partner are having a baby. Geoff will take 2 months off. (7 weeks) Geoff will be back in June. He teaches Chemistry 30 and Physics 20. By doing accelerated Chemistry 30 the departmental can be written in April. Mr. Bouchard can help with Physics.

There have been conversations with Ecole Desrocher about trying to share classes. This will result in financial savings. The staff of Jasper Junior/Senior High School does the best they can with what they have.

6.6 Dare to Care—“A unique program regarded as the most comprehensive and practical bullying prevention program in Canada” [www.daretocare.ca](http://www.daretocare.ca) Mark is going to a meeting on Wednesday to learn about this initiative. It is geared towards grade 7 to 9 students. There is a presentation for the students at the end of April. Encourages students to “Look beyond yourself.”

The “Vaping Maze”....the students knew a lot of the information. The information was from sources other than school, could make some think twice about vaping.

## 7.0 REPORTS

7.1 Principal's Report—Semester 2 is starting. Basketball is underway. There is talk about getting rid of paper report cards, they can be accessed online. Parents that attended this month's meeting have said they like the paper report cards, it allows the teacher's to put their own comments in.

7.2 Trustee's Report—The zone is doing “Community Engagement Events”. One will be held here the evening of March 4<sup>th</sup>. The conversation will address education K to 12 in each zone. There are 4 questions that the Board is asking:

1. What does it mean to be an educated person in our community?
2. What do you think are the key skills our graduates require coming into the work force/adulthood?
3. What are our blind spots? What are we not seeing?
4. How are you or will you, as a stakeholder, support public education in this community?
